Your Excellency,

I am writing to you from the Oxford Union, in the hopes that you will do our society the historic honour of allowing us to receive your second visit here as President of Sri Lanka. Though we understand there must be many pressures upon your time, still we hope that you might do us the unique honour of such a visit, in what would be the first return of an incumbent Head of State to our society.

The occasion for our renewed invitation lies in the treasured historic links between our institution and the country of Sri Lanka, and the congratulations we would thus like to extend you for your successful campaign to win second term as President of Sri Lanka. In this and in many other ways your Presidency has without doubt been of unique importance in the history of your country. Indeed, in order to give you the fullest benefit from your time in Oxford, it would be my pleasure to arrange for you a tour of one of our University's greatest institutions; Christ Church, seat of Oxford Cathedral and the traditional alma mater of many leading British political and spiritual leaders. A unique college, Christ Church has produced thirteen British Prime Ministers, and continues to be at the the very heart of modern British political and intellectual development. Christ Church also has had historic ties with Sri Lanka, for it was here that S.W.R.D. Bandaranaike (who also held the role of Treasurer at the Oxford Union) was educated during his time in Oxford.
